£18m Friargate Regeneration Vision Gets a Coffee Break

A welcome addition to the ambitious £18 million regeneration of Preston's Friargate has been given the go-ahead by city planners. They have approved a move to demolish an old electricity sub-station on Great Shaw Street and build in its place a modern new retail unit.

The plans were submitted by Portergate Developments and the new building on the site, which is on the corner of Friargate, will become part of the stylish mixed-used regeneration project that is fast emerging in the historic part of the city. The transformation of the strategic 1.5 acre site is already delivering three new retail premises and a 244-bedroomed building providing boutique hotel-style accommodation aimed at local



students and employees of Preston's high-tech manufacturing sector and new Enterprise Zone.

This latest new single-storey retail unit has been earmarked as a coffee shop and takeaway serving Friargate's new community. Work to demolish the existing building will begin shortly.

Leading Commercial Property Experts Appointed

Lambert Smith Hampton are about to begin marketing the retail units which make up part of the stylish mixed-use project.

The 6,000 sq ft of quality retail space can be split into three units, ranging in size from 750 sq ft to 4,000 sq ft and will be available to let later this year.

The retail zone sits beneath the 244-bedroom development which will provide boutique hotelstyle accommodation aimed at local students and employees of Preston's high-tech manufacturing sector and new Enterprise Zone.

Gareth Hine, Associate Director Retail at Lambert Smith Hampton in Manchester, says the units would be ideal for convenience store or café operators. He believes their location is a major plus point.

He said: "The new development sits in a prime

position on one of Preston's busiest thoroughfares between the University Quarter and the city centre.







"The area is beginning to be transformed at Portergate's development is playing a key role in the regeneration of this historic part of the city. "The University of Central Lancashire has committed an investment of £200 million towards the development of the Adelphi Square campus."

"Their vision over the next 10 years is to create a 'unified, sustainable and welcoming campus which will enhance the experience for all those visiting the university,' seamlessly integrating with the rest of the City. Friargate is set to really benefit from that project."

Portergate's Chairman Anthony Jackson said: "Lambert Smith Hampton has a wealth of experience in the retail sector and we look forward working with them to attract quality operators who will really add something to Friargate.

"The fact the units sit underneath what will be a new community for Friargate also make them an attractive proposition to retailers. We look forward to them attracting a lot of interest."

Portergate's retail and apartment complex has been designed around open garden areas while being conveniently located in the heart of the city.

Portergate, which already offers hotel-class student accommodation in Salford, has plans to roll its luxury accommodation concept out across the North West of England.

Portergate Launches Preston Recruitment Drive

Portergate is launching a recruitment drive to create the team that will manage and operate its new £18 million development in the heart of Preston. The new recruits will deliver the group's boutique hotel-style service at Friargate Court once it opens its doors to welcome students at the University of Central Lancashire (UCLan) later this year.

Vacancies exist for a range of positions from housekeeping to concierge.

- The development is scheduled for completion this year

Portergate Property Management (PPM) has already made its first staff appointments at Friargate as it looks to create its Preston team. Elaine Mason will be the development's accommodation manager and Steven Dyson will be in charge of maintenance. Both will also carry out the same role at Portergate's highly-successful flagship Riverside House student accommodation in Salford.



Elaine, from Lytham (pictured opposite) brings with her a wealth of experience in the hotel and education sectors, including life as housemistress at a boarding school for girls. She has also worked for hotel groups across the UK.

Steven, from south Manchester (pictured below) is experienced in a whole host of trades – from electrics and plumbing to joinery – which are ideal in fulfilling the role of ensuring both Portergate developments are properly looked after.

Work is continuing to complete the construction of Friargate Court, which sits near the city's University Quarter, and the recruitment process is being

timed to coincide with the final stages leading to its official opening. Portergate prides itself on the quality and levels of service and support residents at its hotel-class properties receive once they move in.

Managing Director Karen Preece said: "Our recruitment process will get underway shortly. We're looking for people who bring the right sort of experience and attitude, who understand the ethos and values of our business.

"The tremendously high standards Portergate sets reflect the demands and expectations of today's students, and in particular their parents, who expect their sons and daughters to live in hotel-class accommodation while they enjoy their higher education.

"Everyone who works at Portergate is very passionate about what it does, with a total commitment to quality and that's what the team we will be recruiting at Friargate will deliver."

The Friargate development is part of Portergate's ambitious North West expansion plans and is scheduled to be completed in the autumn. Portergate's successful Riverside House student accommodation in Salford has been a major success story and welcomes students from across the globe.
