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Project Description

The work involves the remodelling of the live primary school, which includes two classroom extensions, a new nursery extension and a new main entrance. The work will require digging out for footings then building new brickwork and blockwork walls, with new roofs being constructed. There will also be some breaking through into existing areas. This will be done during weekends and school holidays to avoid disruption.

Upcoming Works

Brickwork and blockwork is now built up to wall plate height and window and door openings have been formed. The wall plate has been fitted and roof trusses have been erected. Classroom 1 and 2 at the rear are now ready for the roofer to start felt and battening out ready for tiles. Trocol flat roofs are ready to be installed. Upcoming works are:

- Windows, doors.
- All roofs to be tiled and trocol roofs to be installed.
- Internal works can then progress

Questions & Answers

Will the work affect the school, children and staff?

We are trying our hardest not to let the works affect any of the school, children and staff with delivery of materials coming as little as possible and trying to restrict the size of delivery wagons/vans where possible. Delivery times are restricted to avoid contact with children drop off and pick up times and also around children's breaks and dinner.

Will the work affect the neighbours?

We are trying our hardest not to let the works affect any of the neighbours with delivery of materials coming as little as possible and trying to restrict the size of delivery wagons/vans where possible.

Will parking be affected?

Unfortunately with site compound being a tight area we are requiring a few parking spaces, but we are car sharing to avoid too much disruption.

Will there be any noisy periods?


All break through and noisy works are being done out of hours for the school, there are no further major noisy periods, just general day to day activities on site with the odd delivery.
